ANNUAL REPORT 2022 - 2023



Dear Friends,

Last year brought unprecedented challenges, most notably the January 2023 floods that deeply affected our community. Despite obstacles, City Farm SLO demonstrated unwavering commitment to our mission by expanding our youth education programs to serve more than 1,900 SLO County kids, extending services to regional farmers through our *City Farmer Collaborative*, and modeling regenerative agriculture practices for more than 3,000 visiting community members, farmers, and aspiring farmers. A couple of last year's events and achievements stand out:

Responding to the Impact of the January 2023 Floods:

Through swift action and with the support of our generous donors and community, we channeled crucial grant funding to our tenant farmers which helped alleviate the impacts of the floods on their farm businesses. In addition to financial support, we teamed up with nonprofit and agency partners to organize two regional gatherings for small-scale farmers which provided essential disaster recovery resources, technical assistance, and a platform for farmers to share their experiences and knowledge. Future flood risk at City Farm SLO has been partially mitigated by our *Prefumo Creek Restoration and Enhancement Project* which is restoring critical habitat for native species and providing recreational and educational opportunities for community members.

Expanding Our Therapeutic Horticulture Program:

With support from Cal Poly Construction Management Students and generous donors, we completed our '*Garden for All*,' a fully accessible space for students to grow. With this new space, we doubled the size and impact of our Therapeutic Horticulture Program. Now serving five groups and more than 40 students, our regularly occurring therapeutic farm sessions help students with disabilities build critical life skills through farm-based activities.

I'd like to extend heartfelt appreciation to our dedicated team, volunteers, donors, and partners. Together, we are growing the next generation of agricultural leaders!

OUR MISSION

To empower the next generation to live healthier, more prosperous lives through sustainable agriculture and farm-based education.



YOUTH EDUCATION PROGRAMS



City Farm SLO's **Youth Empowerment Program (YEP)** provides career and college readiness workshops and technical instruction to underserved youth in SLO County through intensive summer workshops and internships. To date, 95 teens have graduated from YEP and 6 teens have completed paid summer internships.

Since 2013, City Farm SLO has partnered with Pacific Beach High School to offer twice-weekly **Farm Class** including instruction in team-building, employment readiness, nutrition, and food literacy. Students learn to grow, harvest, and cook wholesome foods alongside City Farm SLO farmers and instructors. In 2022-2023, 60 high schoolers participated in more than 930 individual instruction hours during Farm Class. City Farm SLO's **Therapeutic Horticulture Program** helps students with disabilities build critical life skills though farmbased activities. The program has doubled its reach, now including special day classes from SLO High School, Laguna Middle School, and Los Osos Middle School. Extensive research correlates therapeutic horticulture with improved mental well-being, physical health, and social self-efficacy. Feedback from our partnering instructors shows that 100% of participants have experienced a mental health benefit as a result of sessions.





City Farm SLO's **Farm Field Trips** connect students with food and where it comes from. Students experience the farm as a living classroom, investigating concepts in plant science, soils, nutrition, and food literacy. In 2022-2023, 22 classrooms and more than 600 students participated in on-farm field trips, and 1,170 students engaged in **Virtual Field Trips**.



TENANT FARMING PROGRAM

It is becoming increasingly difficult for small-scale farmers in California to begin or continue farming because of barriers to accessing land, water, markets, and training.

City Farm SLO provides affordable land leases and supportive services in our tenant farming program. In 2022, we expanded services through our USDA Grant, *Scaling and Expanding San Luis Obispo County Farmer Collaborative Partnerships*, which established a farmer collaborative to provide training, technical assistance, and enhanced market opportunities. 12.75 acres are currently leased to our tenant farmers. In 2022-2023, our tenant farmers produced over 115,000 pounds of fruits and vegetables for our local food system.




2023 Revenue: \$389,795


